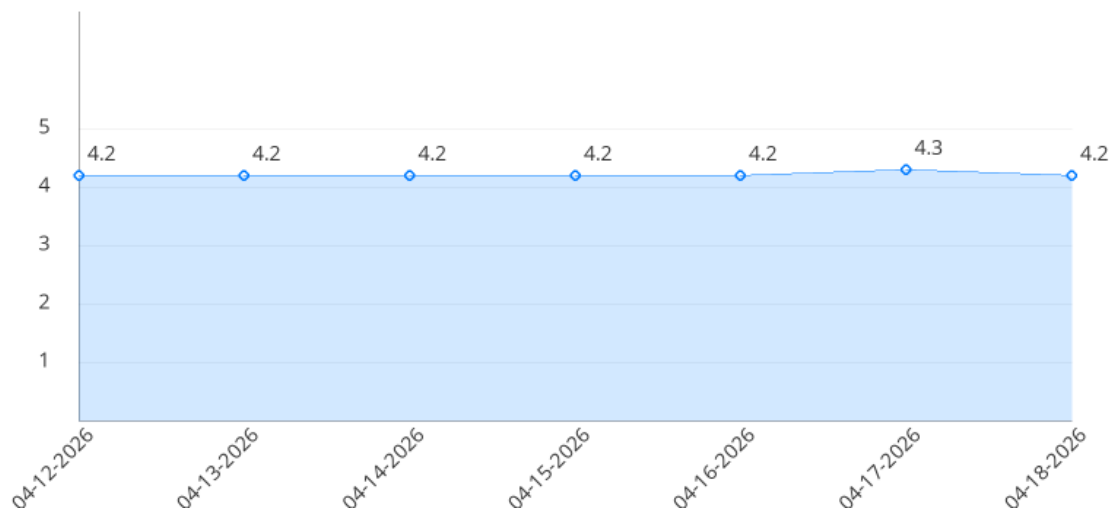

Nuclear War

Score Trend (Week of April 12–18, 2026)



This week, the nuclear threat level remains elevated due to several geopolitical tensions and developments. The breakdown of US-Iran nuclear talks has significantly contributed to heightened global tensions, with Iran showing no signs of abandoning its nuclear ambitions. Additionally, North Korea's expansion of its nuclear arsenal and Russia's potential space-based nuclear ambitions are causing further concern. - **[Industry]** Invest in technologies that improve verification and monitoring capabilities for nuclear treaties and agreements.
- **[International Organizations]** Facilitate urgent diplomatic talks involving North Korea to address and de-escalate nuclear developments.
- **[Government]** Enhance surveillance and defense systems to counter potential space-based nuclear threats.

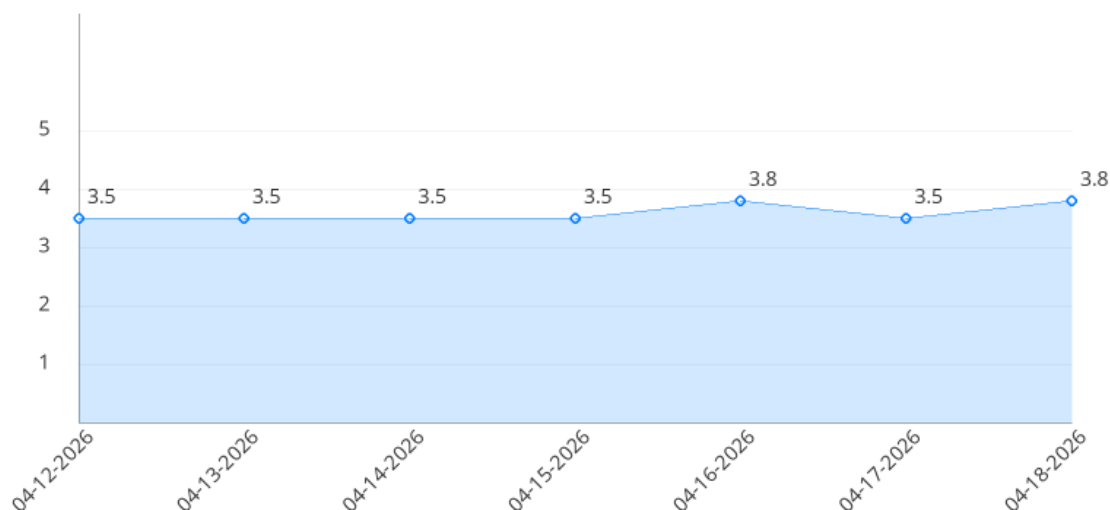

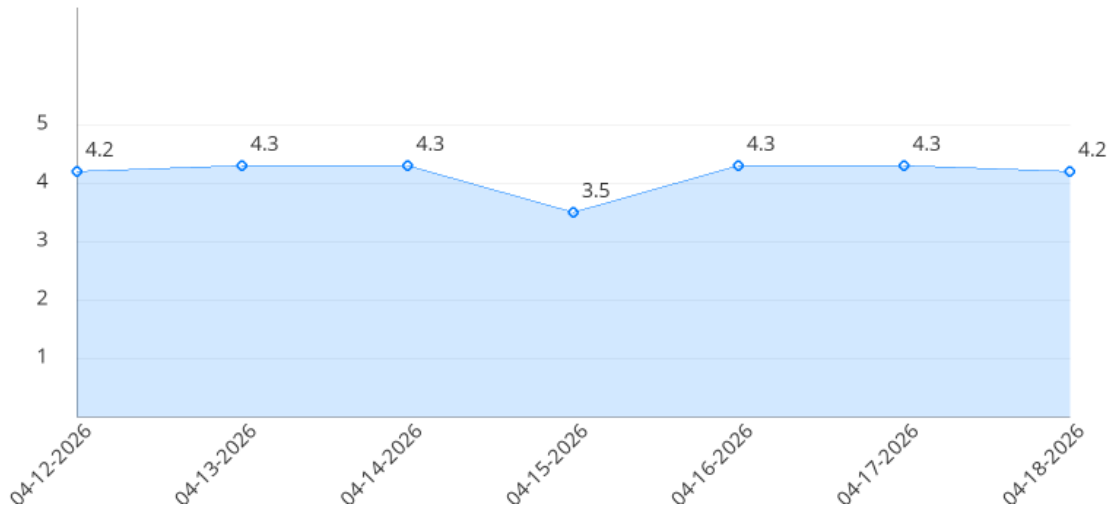

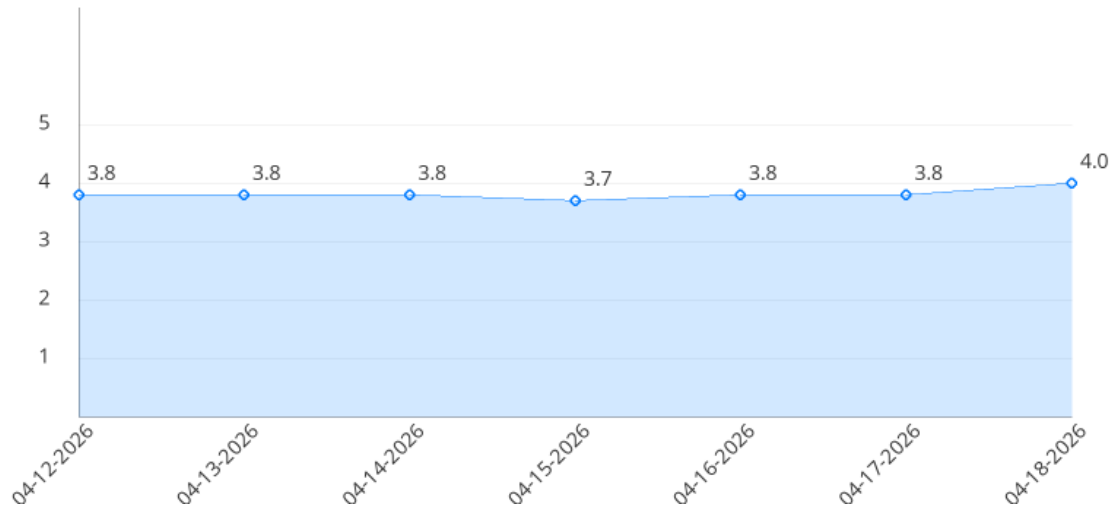

Score Trend (Week of April 12–18, 2026)



This week, the pandemic risk remains moderate, primarily due to ongoing outbreaks of measles, avian flu, and the emergence of new COVID-19 variants. Challenges such as vaccine hesitancy and misinformation continue to hinder effective vaccine uptake, exacerbating the situation. The risk level increased to high on April 18 due to the widespread impact of long COVID and the resurgence of MERS cases. Efforts are needed to enhance surveillance, improve public health communication, and address misinformation to mitigate these risks.

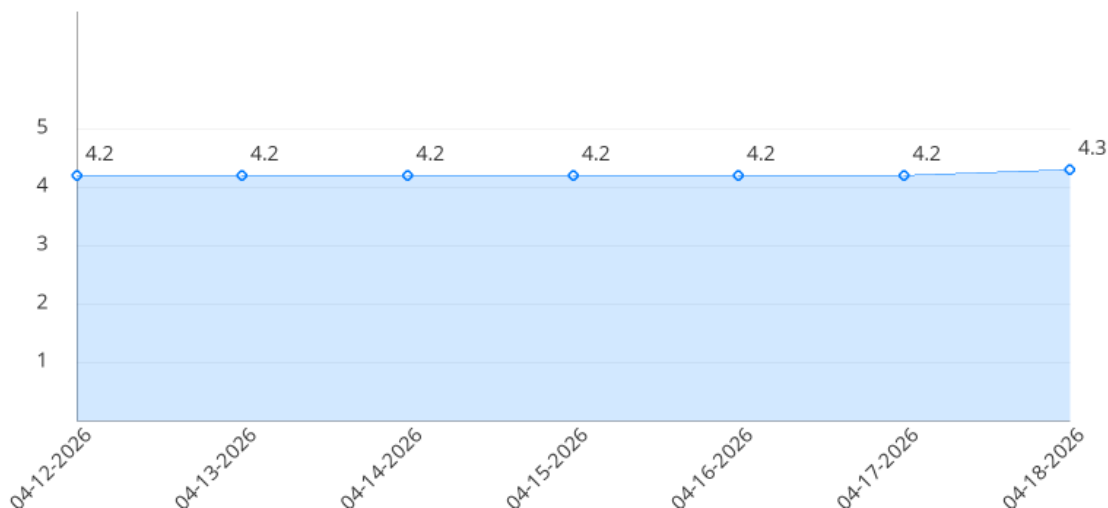

Information Integrity

Score Trend (Week of April 12–18, 2026)



This week, the global threat level from misinformation and disinformation remains high, consistently scoring 4.2 to 4.3. The primary drivers of this risk include AI-generated content, deepfakes, and politically charged falsehoods, which are impacting elections, health, and geopolitical tensions. High-profile figures are often targeted, with deepfakes and fake quotes distorting public perception. Additionally, scams and fake apps are contributing to financial and social harm, further eroding public trust. The pervasive nature of these threats highlights the urgent need for enhanced detection tools, public awareness, and regulatory measures to address the spread of misinformation.



Information Integrity

Recommended Risk Reduction Actions

- **[Government]** Implement stricter regulations and penalties for the creation and dissemination of AI-generated misinformation and deepfakes.
- **[Industry]** Enhance AI detection tools and algorithms to better identify and flag deepfake content and misinformation across digital platforms.
- **[NGO]** Launch public awareness campaigns to educate citizens on recognizing and reporting misinformation and scams.
- **[Education]** Integrate media literacy and critical thinking skills into school curricula to empower individuals to critically evaluate information sources.
- **[International Organizations]** Collaborate internationally to develop strategies and tools for combating misinformation and supporting victims of scams.

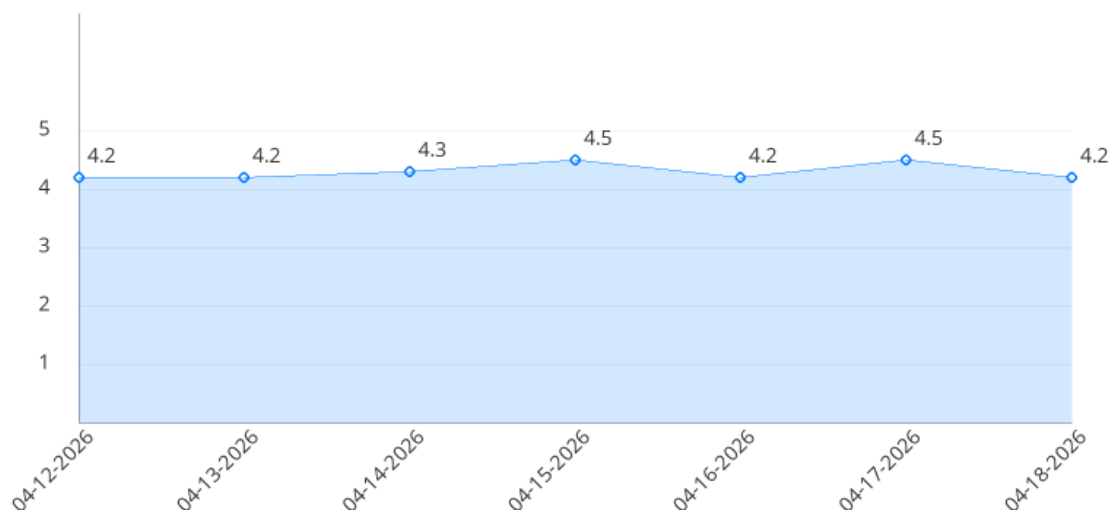

Score Trend (Week of April 12–18, 2026)
